### EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

At a minimum, the plan must include but is not limited to the following elements [29 CFR 1910.38(c)]:

Means of Reporting fires and other emergencies.

Evacuation procedures and emergency escape route assignments.

Procedures for employees who remain to operate critical plant operations before they evacuate.
